Mid councils retain an additional 25% for ministries of peace and reconciliation. Lehigh Presbytery uses their 25% to fund churches mission projects. Faith Presbyterian Church has been a recipient of this fund.

The remaining 50% is used by the Presbyterian Mission Agency to advocate for peace and justice in cultures of violence, including our own, through collaborative projects of education and Christian witness.

The **Peace & Global Witness Offering** will be received today, **World Communion Sunday, October 1**.

In 2022, Faith Presbyterian Church received **\$1,780.00**, with **\$445.00** going towards support of *East Penn Neighbors Helping Neighbors*.

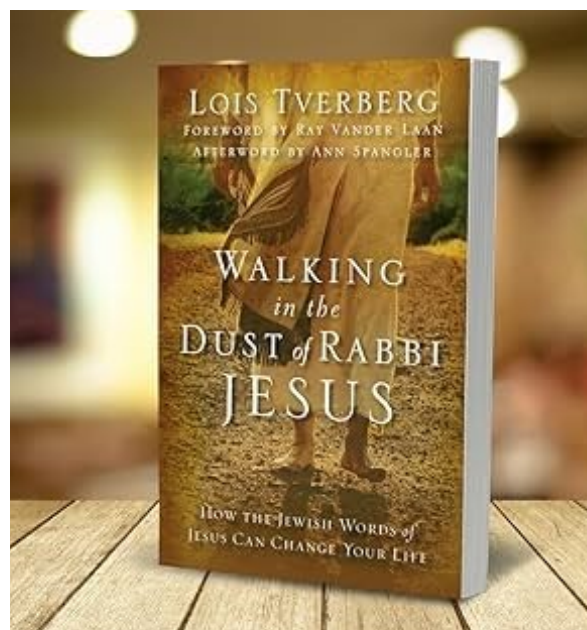
THURSDAY WOMEN'S STUDY GROUP
