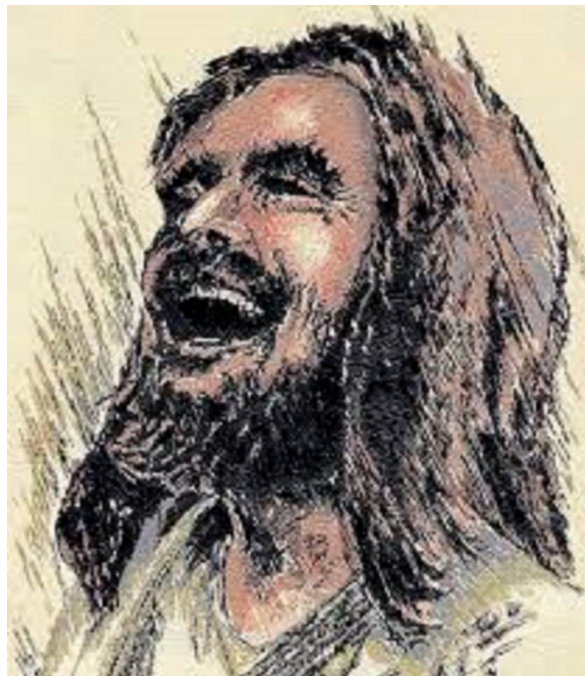

## LITANY OF AFFIRMATION

**Leader:** Sometimes, the world isn't funny. Bright Sunday isn't about denying that darkness exists in the world. Bright Sunday, or Holy Humor Sunday, is about celebrating the reality that God comes into dark places. Jesus laid in the darkness of the tomb and came out right back out again, bringing light where light wasn't expected. Our confession prayer is about recognizing we have dark spaces in us, too. And we trust God to come into the tombs of our hearts and bring light there again in ways we didn't expect. It's a chance to be honest: we aren't perfect. God knows this about us and loves us and all of our imperfections. So let us confess the ways we fell short of glory this week, trusting that God's grace is still shining light over our dark places.

**People:** God of mercy, hear our prayers of confession. There are things we did that we shouldn't have done. There are things we didn't do that we should have done. We said things when we needed to be silent and we kept silent when we needed to speak up. We didn't always love well. We didn't always see the people right in front of us. We spent more time worrying about what others think of us than we did about how we're serving you and celebrating your Easter miracle. Lift us up as we try to do better. Guide us in your ways and teach us what to do next.

SECOND SCRIPTURE LESSON  
(Common English Bible)

JOHN 21:1-19

21 Later, Jesus himself appeared again to his disciples at the Sea of Tiberias. This is how it happened: 2 Simon Peter, Thomas (called Didymus<sup>[a]</sup>), Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, Zebedee's sons, and two other disciples were together. 3 Simon Peter told them, "I'm going fishing." They said, "We'll go with you." They set out in a boat, but throughout the night they caught nothing. 4 Early in the morning, Jesus stood on the shore, but the disciples didn't realize it was Jesus. 5 Jesus called to them, "Children, have you caught anything to eat?" They answered him, "No." 6 He said, "Cast your net on the right side of the boat and you will find some." So they did, and there were so many fish that they couldn't haul in the net. 7 Then the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It's the Lord!" When Simon Peter heard it was the Lord, he wrapped his coat around himself (for he was naked) and jumped into the water. 8 The other disciples followed in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they weren't far from shore, only about one hundred yards. 9 When they landed, they saw a fire there, with fish on it, and some bread. 10 Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish that you've just caught." 11 Simon Peter got up and pulled the net to shore. It was full of large fish, one hundred fifty-three of them. Yet the net hadn't torn, even with so many fish. 12 Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." None of the disciples could

bring themselves to ask him, "Who are you?" They knew it was the Lord. 13 Jesus came, took the bread, and gave it to them. He did the same with the fish. 14 This was now the third time Jesus appeared to his disciples after he was raised from the dead.

15 When they finished eating, Jesus asked Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?"

Simon replied, "Yes, Lord, you know I love you."

Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." 16 Jesus asked a second time, "Simon son of John, do you love me?"

Simon replied, "Yes, Lord, you know I love you."

Jesus said to him, "Take care of my sheep." 17 He asked a third time, "Simon son of John, do you love me?"

Peter was sad that Jesus asked him a third time, "Do you love me?" He replied, "Lord, you know everything; you know I love you."

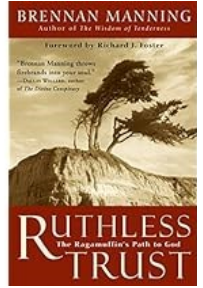
